Old Business

President Birx began her announcements by restating that our meetings will continue to be held under CDC guidelines: Masks are mandatory;

No machines will be used during the presentation as all members are expected to be quiet out of respect for the presenter.

SMU and Japanese paleontologists find second hadrosaurid species


Hadrosaurs, known for their broad, flattened snouts, are the most commonly found of all dinosaurs. The plant-eating dinosaurs lived in the Late Cretaceous period more than 65 million years ago and their fossilized remains have been found in North America, Europe, Africa and Asia.


Dinosaurs!!

An international team of paleontologists has identified a new genus and species of hadrosaur or duck-billed dinosaur, Yamatosaurus izanagii, on one of Japan's southern islands.

The fossilized discovery yields new information about hadrosaur migration, suggesting that the herbivores migrated from Asia to North America instead of vice versa. The discovery also illustrates an evolutionary step as the giant creatures evolved from walking upright to walking on all fours. Most of all, the discovery provides new information and asks new questions about dinosaurs in Japan. Uniquely adapted to chewing, hadrosaurs had hundreds of closely spaced teeth in their cheeks.

Philadelphia January 01 LY 1822

Respected Friend,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your favor of the 8th Inst and also the box of minerals you had the goodness to forward to me. Agreeably to my promise to you when I saw you last I shall not open the box until you shall be present relying however with full confidence in your judgment I am satisfied that the specimens are interesting. Dr elesade has obtained a room in the University and he is now engaged in removing his minerals from the Academy to the place where we shall have an opportunity of seeing his whole collection at one view. He appears to be disposed to be liberal and promising to give you specimins of assay in all his American minerals

Our friend Mr Jefoup has brought his wife to Phil_ attention to her will necifarrly before his zeal for mineralogy. This must not however prevent us from pursuing the subject with prudents indirectly. The season is approaching when you will be able to resume your mineralogy excursions and I shall expect to have the pleasure of hearing from you frequently

Bench Tips from Brad Smith

Brad Smith's Bench Tips are a monthly feature of Rock Talk

SEPARATING DISCS

Separating Discs (also called Cutoff Wheels) are inexpensive and do a great job cutting or shaping steel. You can use them to sharpen tool points, cut piano wire to length, make slots, and sharpen worn drills. Other uses include modifying pliers and making your own design stamps.

My preference is the one inch diameter size. Be sure to hold the wheel firmly so nothing moves to break the disc, and definitely wear your safety glasses. Those are little flakes of steel coming off the disk.

BTW - Separating Discs are rather poor at soft metals like copper, silver and gold. Soft metals clog up the cutting edges.



DEBURRING JUMP RINGS

When cutting jump rings from large gauge wire for chain making, you'll notice the saw leaves a small burr. An easy way to remove these is to tumble the rings with some fine-cut pyramids. It's best not tumble for a long period with the pyramids because it will remove the polished finish from the wire.

No tumbler, no problem. You don't actually need a tumbler. I just put a handful of pyramids in a wide mouth plastic jar and shake for a bit. You can find these pyramids in the tumble finishing section of most jewelry supply catalogs.


